

CALIFORNIA'S MINIMUM WAGE ON THE RISE

On September 25, 2013, Governor Brown signed Assembly Bill 10, raising the minimum wage in California from \$8.00 per hour to \$10.00 per hour over two years.

The new law currently schedules the first increase in minimum wage to **\$9.00** per hour on **July 1, 2014**. The state minimum wage is then scheduled to increase to **\$10.00** per hour on **January 1, 2016**.

Both San Jose and San Francisco already have city-wide minimum wage ordinances setting minimum wage in excess of \$10.00 per hour. San Jose's Minimum Wage Ordinance was passed by voters on November 6, 2012, requiring employees be paid a minimum wage of \$10.00 per hour for work performed within San Jose. Effective **January 1, 2014**, minimum wage in **San Jose** will increase to **\$10.15** per hour. San Francisco's minimum wage is currently **\$10.55** per hour. San Francisco has not yet announced its minimum wage rate for 2014.
